



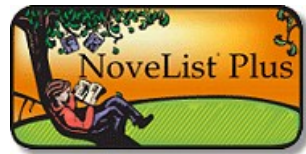

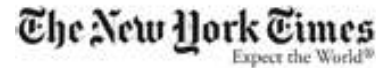

Online Catalog

Perform a Search

(search.sussexcountylibrary.org).

- Type your search
- If the library system owns the item, it will appear in the list.
- You can sort and limit the list.
- Click on the item you would like.
- Scroll down to see information about the item, which branch owns it and its status (whether it is checked in or out)
- If the item is checked out, you can request the item. See instruction for “**Placing a Hold**”

Other Features

Use “**My Discoveries**” to create lists, Rate or Review a title

Placing a Hold

When you find the item you want:

- Click “**Place Hold**”
- Type in your **entire barcode number (no spaces)** and your **PIN #** (last 4 digits of your phone number) and click **Login**.
- Choose the library branch where you wish to pick up your hold and click **Request**. You should see a message that says “**Your Request Has Been Successfully Placed.**”

Patron Information

To view your patron record including:

1. Items you have placed on hold
 2. Items you have checked out
- Click on **My Account**
 - Type in your **entire library card barcode number (no spaces)** and your **PIN #** (last 4 digits of your phone number) and click **LOGIN**.

Now you can view:

- **Items Out & Items on Hold**

You can also Renew Items

(**Not yet overdue**)

- Go to **Checked Out**
- Click in the box to place a check mark next to the item(s) you wish to renew
- Click on **Renew** (above on the left side of the screen)

You will be told if the items were renewed and a new due date will appear. Please note the date.

If the item did not renew, a message will _____ appear at the top of the box in red explaining the reason.

Online Databases

To use any of the Databases from home, you will need the barcode # on the back of your library card.

To access full-text articles in:

- Newspapers, Magazines
- Images, Reference Books
- Primary Source Documents

Click on **Databases** and then choose the database that best fits your topic.

Literature Resource Center, including Contemporary Authors, provides access to biographies, bibliographies, and critical analyses of authors. It covers more than 120,000 novelists, poets, essayists, journalists, and other writers, with in-depth coverage of 2,500 of the most-studied authors.
